Cardboard (corrugated cardboard only; no wax coating): 1, 2	Keep cardboard dry; collapse; remove plastics and polystyrene foam
CDs, DVDs & cases; electronic remotes & controllers; wires & cables: 27	Recycling kiosk at front of store
Cell phones, pagers, PDAs: 17, 26, 27	
Clothing, linens, accessories: 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11	Clean items
Compact fluorescent bulbs: 26, 28	
Computers/Electronics (in working order): 4, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 16 (scrap) computers, stereos, TVs, VCRs: 1, 4, 6, 17, 27	Computers must be late models in working condition for donation 1 (\$5 fee per item); 4 (no TVs); 17 & 27 (\$10 fee may apply)
Eyeglasses: 19	Prescription glasses
Furniture (clean & in good condition): 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 (no longer usable): 1	\$5 fee small items; \$15 fee large items
Glass bottles and jars (mixed colors): 1	Rinse glass; labels are ok; no lids, windows, Pyrex, glasses or dishes
Household hazardous waste (household cleaners, paints, kerosene, pharmaceuticals, pesticides, fertilizers, etc.): 1	Only during a special collection event day held once in spring & once in fall; contact the City of Stillwater for more information 533-8484
Household items: 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11	Clean and in working condition
Ink jet & laser cartridges: 4, 17, 18, 27	Store credit may be available
Motor oil: 1, 12	12 (5 gallon maximum)
Oil (vegetable) & fat: 1	
Packing peanuts, polystyrene foam blocks (Styrofoam): 1, 20	Items must be clean and intact
Paper (news paper, office paper, magazines, bags, paperboard (i.e. cereal boxes)): 1, 2, 21	21 (no phone books or cardboard) Keep paper dry; glossy ads, colored paper and staples are okay
Plastic containers (bottles, jars, tubs, and similar marked #1-#7): 1, 2	#1 - #7 on bottom of container; rinse; collapse if possible; lids & caps are okay
Plastic grocery bags: 22, 23, 26, 27	May mix with other clean, thin, plastic bags; remove receipts
Scrap metal: 1, 3, 4	
Shoes, purses, belts, luggage: 25	Will repair or recycle
Tires: 1	Up to 17.5"
Yard waste (in bags or bundles 4' length, 18" diameter max.): 1, 24	1 (one load p/day p/resident); 24 (loosely secure bags at top; tie bundles)

Reduce, Reuse and Recycle in Stillwater

Recycling facts:

- The average American creates 4.6 pounds of garbage each day or over 3 tons annually per family of four
- One ton of recycled paper saves 3,700 lbs of lumber and 24,000 gallons of water
- Recycling a soda can saves 96% of the energy used to make a can from ore
- Recycling employs 1.1 million people nationwide

How to reduce:

- Purchase items in bulk
- Avoid over-packaged products
- Choose durable goods over disposables
- Buy only what you need

Reuse & recycling tips:

- Save time and energy by visiting drop-off sites on your way to other destinations
- Maintain and repair items
- Compost yard waste and food scraps
- Use a self-mulching mower and leave grass clippings on the lawn
- Make double-sided copies when printing
- Drink water from a reusable bottle
- Buy items with recycled content and “close the loop” by creating a market for recycled products

If in doubt, throw it out!

Non-recyclable items mixed in with similar materials that are recyclable may contaminate a load of material and make it unacceptable for processing. (If so, the entire load may be dumped in the landfill.) If in doubt, throw it out!

Curbside recycling pilot program:

The City of Stillwater is conducting a pilot curbside recycling program. Should the program be adopted city-wide, all households may recycle paper products, cans, and plastics #1-7 at their curbs. Glass bottles/jars and other items will continue to be accepted at the Convenience Collection Center.

Full-service recycling drop-off site:
